Comments	Only broken names (from patronyms) are preserved, sometimes followed by the mentions ἱερεύς, <i>hiereus</i> (four times: I.Histriae 195, ll. 1, 4, 5, 6), ἱέρ(ε)ια, <i>hier(e)ia</i> (two times: I.Histriae 195, ll. 8, 10), and φυλ]ότειμος, <i>phil]oteimos</i> (one time: I.Histriae 195, l. 9).

## XIII. EVALUATION

i. Private association	Possible
Note	The only reason to suspect in this <i>album</i> the list of the members of an association is the presence of the priests and priestesses as well as of a φυλ]ότειμος, <i>phil]oteimos</i> . Nothing to say about the character of the association. The alternative explanation would be that we have to do with a simple list of priests and priestesses.
