XII. NOTES

i. Comments	The dedication is made by the <i>strategos</i> (1. 3-6) <i>PtwIms son of Pa-n</i> (Ptolemaios son of Panas) and a village scribe, $P \square - \square \square m-p \square$ son of $B.\square -sr-Ws$ (Pachompshenes son of Psenosiris). We do not know if they had a role in the association or if they just took part in the dedication. The <i>strategos</i> Ptolemaios son of Panas has several religious titles cited in the inscription (1. 3-5): prophet of Hathor ($p \square \square m-n \square r \square$), wrophet of Horus ($p \square \square m-n \square$), prophet of Hy ($p \square \square m-n \square r$ $I \square$) yprophet of Isis ($p \square \square m-n \square$); overset of the treasury of Hathor, mistress of Ioun, of Isis the great goddess, of Horus the Behedite, great god master of the sky ($p \square mrp \square pr-\square \square n \square w.t-\square r nb \square w$
