Comments	Although among the members there are some bearers of Thracian names or of the name Ἑλλην, <i>Hellen</i> (which is common in Odessos for Thracians claiming integration; see Dana, M., and Dana, D. 2013), it is not probable that the association was constituted for the cult of a Thracian god. For another similar association in Odessos see CAPInv. 1153 . The names (with patronyms) of two of the members are inscribed on the left and right side of the relief; they might be the <i>epimeletai</i> charged for putting the dedication, as in IGBulg I ² 77 (CAPInv. 1153).
