i. Local interaction	We can only posit interaction between the <i>grapheion</i> and this particular group of salt merchants.

i. Comments	It is tempting to include this reference with those in P.Mich. V 245 (CAPInv. 1658), but in the light of the lack of further evidence than recorded here, it seems best to record this group as a different entity.
