ii. References to buildings/objects	The inscription records the equipping and decoration of a building belonging to the group, οἶκος (line 2), and the construction of a μαγειρεῖον (line 3).

VII. ORGANIZATION

ii. Leadership	<i>archon</i> , ἄρχων (lines 4-5)
Eponymous office	The inscription is dated ἐπὶ ἄρχοντος Ποπ(λίου) Οὐ[ι]πτανίου Μενάν[δ]ρου, presumably indicating the eponymous office of the group.
iv. Officials	archipoimenos, ἀρχιποίμενος (line 6)

VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

i. Treasury/Funds	See immediately below.
ii. Realty	The references to buildings (see VI.ii) and to a 'chief shepherd' (VII.iv) suggest that the group possessed properties and presumably had access to both funds and revenue.

i. Number	At least 3 individuals are attested in the text.

ii. Meetings and events	The references to buildings intended for meetings and feasting (see VI.ii), suggest that the group met regularly, presumably for collective meals of meat (cf. also VII.iv).
