Leadership	Maybe the four men mentioned with <i>hoi peri</i> (Marcellus, son of Eleis, Hermogenes, son of Deios, Sokrates, son of Germanus, and Hermogenes, son of Tiberius) are the leaders of an association, not only of the <i>hieraphoroi</i> , the carriers of sacred objects (cf. the comment in XIII.i).
iii.	Members	Some of the members of the association act as carriers of the sacred objects (<i>hieraphoroi</i>) in processions and rituals, maybe in the imperial cult.

iii.	Worship	Some of the members of the association act as carriers of the sacred objects (<i>hieraphoroi</i>) in processions and rituals, maybe in the imperial cult.

iv.	Honours/Other activities	Several <i>hieraphoroi</i> of associations and the ostiarii honoured the emperor Caracalla with a statue.

i. Local interaction	The <i>hieraphoroi</i> of several associations collaborate together in processions and rituals as carriers of sacred objects and together with the <i>ostiarii</i> for the erection of a statue.

	Note	Since in the same inscription the <i>hieraphoroi</i> of the (<i>syntechnia</i> of the) wool carders and the association of the porters are named (see <u>CAPInv. 1780</u> and <u>CAPInv. 1781</u>), it is possible that the carriers of sacred objects <i>hoi peri</i> ('those under') are also members of an association. The four men mentioned appear to be the leaders of the group, given that the other members identify themselves as 'those under them'. The nature of this possible association is unknown.
