ii. Name elements	Personal:	The two elements in the name of this association derive from the personal names Hagesitimos and Kallikrates, both of which are profusely attested in Rhodes: see <i>LGPN</i> I, s.vv. Hagesitimos no. 3, and Kallikrates no. 77.

i. Founder(s)	Possibly, the association was founded by Hagesitimos or by Kallikrates or by both of them jointly.
Gender	Male
iii. Members	The person to whom the statue base belonged, of whom we only know that he was the adopted son of Timostratos of the Lindian deme Brasioi (<i>LGPNI</i> , s.v. Timostratos no. 56), was a member of this association.

IX. MEMBERSHIP

iv. Status	The unknown, adoptive son of Timostratos Brasios was a citizen.

X. ACTIVITIES

iv. Honours/Other activities	The <i>Hagesitimeioi kai Kallikrateioi</i> had honoured the (unknown) adoptive son of Timostratos Brasios with the award of a wreath (kind unknown). In the inscription their honour is mentioned together with those separately bestowed on the same person by the <i>Lapethiastai</i> (Λαπηθιασταί), the <i>Diagonia Thymoterpidan</i> (διαγονία Θυμοτεπιδᾶν) and the <i>Hermaistai</i> (Ἑρμαιοσταί).
