VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

i. Treasury/Funds Despite the fragmentary nature of the inscription, it seems that the decree recorded the promise of financial contribution towards the *thiasos* (ll. 6-7), with the amount expected to be donated no less than 100 drachmas (l. 9).

X. ACTIVITIES iii. Worship In line 10 there is a reference to several gods (εἰς τὸς θεὸς, eis tos theos), the precise meaning and context of which eludes us due to the fragmentary nature of the inscription. Deities worshipped theoi

i. Comments	Epimenioi are attested as officials in other associations in Kos (see CAP Inv.) as well as in civic
	subdivisions (e.g. IG XII 4.1 103); in all cases their duties are religious in nature.

XIII. EVALUATION i. Private association Certain Note Although the decree is badly preserved, the occurrence of the term *thiasos*, together with the attestation of *epimemioi* and the promise of a financial contribution all this points towards a private association.
