II. 6, 9-10: εὐχαριστήριον... ἐποίησαν ἐκ τῶν ἰδίων, eucharisterion epoiesan ek ton idion: the sakkophoroi paid out of their own pocket for the thanksoffering, something that may perhaps indicate that they had their own funds.

The sakkophoroi from Kalymnos made an offering of thanks (l. 6: εὐχαριστήριον, eucharisterion) to

Zeus Hypsistos, Hera Ourania, Poseidon Asphaleios, Apollo and the other gods.

ii. Interaction abroad

The *sakkophoroi* from Kalymnos made an offering of thanks to Zeus Hypsistos and several other gods (see X.iii) on behalf of the city of Kos (II. 6-7: ὑπὲρ τῆς Κώιων πόλεως, *hyper tes Koion poleos*). Although a number of dedications were addressed to Zeus Hypsistos and other gods on behalf of the city (IG XII 4.2 541-543), it is the only instance where the city of Kos is explicitly named as such. In this way the *sakkophoroi* of Kalymnos set themselves aside from the political community of Kos, underlying at the same time their place of origin (i.e. Kalymnos).
