ii. Leadership

Given the title of τεχνάρχης, technarche (Salamine de Chypre XIII.1 43, 1. 2) of M. Titus (?) Pantischeinos Athenion, the donor of the dedication, he probably acted as the leader of the association (see BE 1976: no. 750).

i. Comments	Only the possible name and title of the leader of the alleged association is attested: at all events, he acted in his private capacity when setting up the inscription (1. 2: $\&\kappa \tau \hat{\omega} v \delta \delta (\omega v)$, ek ton idion). The techne implied in his title of technarches may refer to broader disciplines than simple sculpture.

i. Private association	Possible
Note	Given the lack of information, on the basis of the sole title of <i>technarches</i> one can only suppose the existence of a possible private association headed by the man.
