ii. Name elements	Personal:	Ἀριστείδεῖοι, <i>Aristeideioi</i> - From the Greek personal name , (LGPN s.v. no. 3). The compound name likely suggests a founder or a benefactor of the association, (cf. Thomsen (forthcoming), Gabrielsen 1997 p. 126-7, Maiuri 1916 p. 141, Poland 1909 p. 73-6).
	Theophoric:	Ἥλιασταί, <i>Haliastai</i> - From the god Helios, a deity with a prominent position in the mythology of Rhodes (Morelli, <i>I culti in Rodi</i> [Pisa, 1959], 15-20, 94-99).
		Ἀθαναισταί, <i>Athanaistai</i> - From the doric spelling of Athena (Morrelli, <i>ibid.</i> 2-13, 80-89).
		Ἑρμαῖσταί, <i>Hermaistai</i> - From the god Hermes (Morrelli, <i>ibid.</i> 44-45, 133-35).
