Comments	The restoration $[\theta\iota\alpha\sigma\hat{\omega}]\tau\alpha[\iota]$, $[thiaso]ta[i]$ is rather hazardous as one can also restore $[\hat{\epsilon}\rho\alpha\nu\sigma]\tau\alpha[\hat{\iota}]$, $[eranis]ta[i]$. It seems to me that the group referred to in this inscription may be associated with the <i>orgeones</i> of the Mother of the Gods (<u>CAPInv. 361</u>). The origin of the inscription and the presence of Ergasion from Samaria (probably the same as the one in IG II ² 1327, <u>CAPInv. 361</u>) argue for the identification. If this is true, then the group had three stewards and at least two of the individuals named here in IG II ² 2943 were also stewards.
