i.b. Document(s) typology & language/script	Greek honorary decree for the magistrates of the association, since they have performed their duties without blemish, followed by a fragmentary list of members.
i.c. Physical format(s)	Marble stele broken on top left, measuring 0,355x0,292m.
ii. Source(s) provenance	Found in Athens, now in the British Museum, Elgin collection 21.

ii. References to buildings/objects	There is a reference to the stone slab (στήλη λιθίνη, <i>stele lithine</i> , ll. 25-6) on which the decree shall be inscribed.
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VII. ORGANIZATION

iii. Members	The members of the group are called Σαραπασταί, <i>Sarapiastai</i> , ll. 2, 10, 12-3, 17.
iv. Officials	Chief- <i>eranistria</i> (προερανίστρια, <i>proeranistria</i> , ll. 23, 29). Steward (ἐπιμελητής, <i>epimeletes</i> , ll. 3-4). Treasurer (ταμίας, <i>tamias</i> , ll. 2, 28, 31). Secretary (γραμματεὺς, <i>grammateus</i> , ll. 3, 33). ιεροποιοὶ (<i>hieropoioi</i> , l. 14). The duties of chief- <i>eranistria</i> included the performance of sacrifices, ll. 24-5, see Arnaoutoglou 1994.
vii. Judicial system	The honoured magistrates have been scrutinized for their term of office, ll. 6-7: [καὶ τὰς] εὐ[θύνας] δεδόκα[σιν] περὶ [πάντ]ων παρὰ τὸν [εὐθύνον], [<i>kai tas eu[thynas] dedoka[sin] peri [pant]on para ton [euthynon]</i>]. The <i>hieropoioi</i> omitting to proclaim the honours or the crown are liable to a fine, ll. 15-7: ἐὰν δὲ μὴ ἀναγορεύσωσιν ἢ μὴ στε[φά]νωσιν, ἀποτεισάτω ἕκαστος αὐτῶν — — δ]ραχμὰς ἱερὰς τοῖς Σαραπασταῖς, <i>ean de me anagoreusos[in e me stepha]nosoi, apoteisato hekastos auf[ton] --- d[rachmas hieras tois Sarapiastais]</i> .

VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

i. Treasury/Funds	The association had a treasury designated as κοινόν, <i>koinon</i> in ll. 27-8: [τὸ] δὲ γενόμενον εἰς ταῦτα ἀνάλω[μα μερίσαι ἐκ τοῦ κοινοῦ, [<i>to] de genomenon eis tauta analo[ma merisai ek t]ou koinou</i>].
iii. Income	The association's preserved income was derived mainly from fines as the one prescribed in ll. 15-7.

iii. Worship	The association performed sacrifices (θυσίαι, <i>thysiai</i> , ll. 13-5 and 23-5).
iv. Honours/Other activities	The magistrates are praised (ἐπαινέσαι, <i>epainesai</i> , ll. 10-1, 22) and honoured with an olive-leaves crown with a ribbon (θαλλοῦ [στεφάνωι σὺν τ]αινιδίωι, <i>thallou [stephanoi syn t]ainidioi</i> , ll. 10-2). Nikippe the <i>proerastria</i> is praised and crowned (ἐπαινέσαι δὲ κα[ὶ] στεφα[ν]ῶσαι, <i>epainesai de ka[i] stephan]osai</i> , ll. 22-3, with no reference to the kind of crown).
