The designation *phretra* for an association has parallels in Phrygia and probably Syria (see the *archiphrator* in IGLS 1 232), which is why Poland included this group. But Sartre 1982: 83 is probably correct in stating that the φρήτρα  $A\alpha\theta\alpha$ ουηνῶν, *phretra Aathaouenon*, should be added "à la liste des noms tribaux." Cf. already Poland 1909: 53, note\*.
