Honours/Other activities | The members of the syngeneia expressed their gratitude to <i>Theos Preietos</i> possibly for protecting their animals as the formula Θεφ Πρειέτφ εὐχαριστήριν κατ'ἐπιταγὴν ὑπὲρ τῶν ζφων ( <i>Theoi Preietoi eucharisterin kat' epitagen hyper ton zoion</i> , II. 2-3) seems to imply (cf. Õğüt-Polat and Şahin 1985: 111 on Theos Preietos as God of domestic animals). They also seem to have thanked Kybele (l. 9: Εὐχαριστοῦμεν τῆ [Μητρί], <i>Eucharistoumen tei [Metri]</i> ) and possibly Zeus (II. 10-11 as restored by Õgüt-Polat and Şahin 1985: 111, κατ' ἐπιταγὴν ΤΟΕΙ Διεὶ εὐχαριστ[οῦμεν], <i>kat' epitagen TOEI Diei eucharist[oumen]</i> ). |



| i.   | Comments     | The cost of the altar may indicate the existence of a common treasury of the group, but there is no clear proof for that. The cost may have been covered from <i>ad hoc</i> contributions paid by the members of the <i>syngeneia</i> , listed by name in the final part of the inscription.  |
