## XIII. EVALUATION

i. Private association	Possible
Note	The inscriptions on the tiles offer no sufficient evidence for the existence of a private association. However the word <i>synodos</i> and the fact that the tiles were found in the vicinity of a <i>heroon</i> do not exclude the possibility that there was an association, perhaps related to the cult or honour of a heros.
