In Mantinea there are, however, several religious associations active in the $1 \mathrm{st} \mathrm{c} . \mathrm{BC} / 1 \mathrm{stc} \mathrm{c}$. AD . It is thus logic to assume that under synodoi private associations of this kind are to be understood.
