Reference context	A man, Apollonios, is defined as being responsible for the collection of the police-tax for <i>ethne</i> and <i>ergasteria</i> of the Themistou meris of the Arsinoite for the 25th regnal year (of Ptolemy III, i.e. 223/4 BC): παρ' Ἀπολλωνίου τοῦ ἐξειληφότος τὸ φυ(λακιτικὸν) ἐθινῶν (l. ἐθνῶν) καὶ ἐρ(γαστηρίων) τῆς Θεμίστου μερίδος εἰς τὸ κε (ἔτος), <i>par' Apolloniou tou exeilephotos to phylakitikon ethnon kai ergasterion tes Themistou meridos eis to 25 etos</i> (ll. 1-3). The man wrote a petition to the <i>oikonomos</i> against his colleague in the tax-farming who allegedly made agreements with those liable to the policetax for a lower rate, thus damaging the contractors.
