| i. Comments | As Robert (in Pékary 1965: 123) has explained, this <i>synodos</i> is certainly the local section of the ἱερὰ θυμελικὴ σύνοδος, <i>hiera thymelike synodos</i> , the international association of musical artists. Its usual name in its fullest form is ἡ ἱερὰ σύνοδος τῶν ἀπὸ τῆς οἰκουμένης περὶ τὸν Διόνυσον καὶ αὐτοκράτορα τεχνειτῶν ἱερονεικῶν στεφανειτῶν καὶ τῶν τούτων συναγωνιστῶν, <i>he hiera synodos ton apo tes oikoumenes peri ton Dionyson kai autokratora techneiton hieroneikon stephaneiton kai ton touton sunagoniston</i> (cf. Aneziri 2009: 222, who also accepts (ibid. 223 n. 40) Roberts identification of the Milesian <i>synodos</i> as the local branch of the worldwide association. |
