i.b. Document(s) typology & language/script	<i>AE</i> 1983: no. 197 is a dedication of a statue to an unknown honorand set up by the <i>Pabonenses</i> , out of love for their city, where the people rejoices with the glory of the local <i>ordo</i> (l. 3) (<i>decurionum</i>). A certain Acerius provided for the base statue (l. 6). The inscription is written in Latin.
i.c. Physical format(s)	White marble base for a statue
ii. Source(s) provenance	Found in 1977 in Pozzuoli, via Luciano, the ancient via Domitiana.

VII. ORGANIZATION

iii. Members	Referred to as <i>Pabonenses</i> (<i>AE</i> 1983: no. 197).
viii. Obligations	The erection of the base statue may imply that the <i>Pabonenses</i> either collected money ad hoc or each member had to pay regularly some sum, which went into the (unattested) treasury.

VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

i. Treasury/Funds	The erection of the base statue may imply that the association had its own funds/treasury.

IX. MEMBERSHIP

ii. Gender	Men
Note	The only attested member is a man: Acerius (<i>AE</i> 1983: no. 197).
iii. Age	Adults
Note	The only attested member is an adult: Acerius (<i>AE</i> 1983: no. 197).
iv. Status	The expression <i>ex amore civitatis nostrae</i> (<i>AE</i> 1983: no. 197, ll. 1-2) implies that the <i>Pabonenses</i> were Puteolan citizens.

X. ACTIVITIES

iv. Honours/Other activities	The <i>Pabonenses</i> awarded a base statue for an unknown honorand. The honor is justified with reference to the love for their city and the glory of the local <i>ordo</i> (<i>decurionum</i>), for which the people rejoices.

i. Local interaction	The honor of the base statue is justified by the <i>Pabonenses</i> with reference to the love for their city and the glory of the local <i>ordo</i> (<i>decurionum</i>).
