i.b. Document(s) typology & language/script	Greek honorific inscription set up by the <i>synodos</i> of the Alexandrians to T. Flavius Acribius native of Alexandria and Roman citizen, who was ἀρχιερεὺς διὰ βίου τοῦ σύμπ[αντος ξυστοῦ], <i>archiereus dia biou tou symp[antos xystou]</i> (ll. 2-5) and a successful athlete, whose numerous victories at the Pythian, Actian, Capitolinean, etc. games (in AD 94, 98, 102 and 106) are listed in ll. 6-32.
i.c. Physical format(s)	Marble slab
ii. Source(s) provenance	Found in 1764 in Naples, Monastero di S.Maria Egiziaca.

ii. Interaction abroad	Formal interaction with Rome and the Imperial institution are to be argued from the terms <i>philosebastos kai philoromaios synodos</i> (l. 2). It was also a travelling <i>synodos</i> (περιπολιστική, <i>peripolistike</i> , l. 3), so we can assume that there was enough interaction abroad. The <i>synodos</i> honored Flavius Acribius, who was a Roman citizen and highpriest for life of the whole athletic <i>xystos</i> , see Moretti 1953: 190-1.
