ii. Realty The orgeones lent 400 drachmas in return for the security of a chorion.

i.	Comments	Fredrich (IG XII.8 21) identifies this group of <i>orgeones</i> with the <i>orgeones</i> of Herakles in Kome (CAPInv. 109) on the basis that this security horos comes from Moudros, located not far away from Kome (followed by Culasso Gastaldi 2006: 519). However, the identification of this group with the group of <i>orgeones</i> of Herakles seems uncertain in the absence of any further textual reference to the name of this group (Finley 1951: 277 n. 10).
