iv. Status	The dedicant, Ptolemaios son of Alexandros, who was presumably a member of the <i>synodos</i> (cf. PP IV 11703a), was an Alexandrian citizen of the deme <i>Aiakideus</i> . It is uncertain whether all the members were Alexandrian citizens.

i. Comments	It is impossible to establish whether this association had anything to do with the <i>synodos</i> of the <i>syngeouchoi</i> of Psenamosis who also had dealings in Alexandria (CAPInv. 38).
