iii. Income	Fines: a fine of 2500 denarii was to be paid in case of violation of the tomb to the association (I.Alexandria Troas 151 l. 4; I.Alexandria Troas 152 l. 3).
iv. Endowments	The deceased in I.Alexandria Troas 152 established a fund (κατέλειψα λεγῶτα, <i>kateleipsa legata</i> l. 3) for decking the tomb with roses during an annual banquet (δεῖπνον, <i>deipnon</i> l. 4). It seems that the celebration of the Rosalia is implied by the verb <i>rodizosin</i> .
