## XII. NOTES

i. Comments	<p>In his commentary to the inscription, D. M. Pippidi suspects that Aba's liberalities conceded to the τέκτωνες, <i>tektones</i>, might be connected with their role as δένδροφόροι, <i>dendrophoroi</i> (bearers of the sacred tree), during the festivals dedicated to Cybele and Attis.</p> <p>Aba was also a benefactress of the <i>Herakleistai</i> (<a href="#">CAPInv. 1209</a>), the <i>Taureastai</i> (<a href="#">CAPInv. 1210</a>), and the <i>speira Dionysiaston presbyteron</i> (<a href="#">CAPInv. 1218</a>).</p>
