For Apollo Νεομήνιος, <i>Neomenios</i> , (i.e. 'of the first day of the month') see <i>Od. 20.156</i> ; Philochor. FGrH 328 F 88b (Lys., fr. 53); SEG 32, 337 (Athens, Kerameikos). For νεομηνιαστάι, <i>neomeniastai</i> , of the Pontic Mother of Gods in Dionysopolis see CAPIv. 1156 .
