Meetings and events	A "common feast" for which the group spend 12 drachmas is mentioned in line 5: ἱστιατορίας κοινω() (δραχμαὶ) ιβ histiatorias koino() (drachmai) 12; a meeting in the temple of Thonis, for which the group spent 10 drachmas, is also mentioned, line 8: συνόδωι ἐν τῷ Θωνιείου (δραχμαὶ) ι, synodoi en to Thonieiou drachmai 10.

i. Local interaction	There is potentially evidence of interaction between associations thanks to a reference to what appears to be a second <i>synodos</i> , the <i>synodos Damarionos</i> (l. 9) (<u>CAPInv. 1369</u>).
