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XII. NOTES

i. Comments	The recognition that SEG 59: 1099, l. 2 should probably be restored to read τὸ κοινὸν τῶν ἱερέων[v], <i>to koinon ton hiero[n]</i> , and so be an honorific erected by a <i>koinon</i> of priests is inspired by the recent publication of a substantial honorific text on bronze set up by a <i>koinon</i> of the priests of Apollo, also from Halaisa (see SEG 59: 1100; CAPInv. 1314). It is highly likely that the text recorded here (SEG 59: 1099) was set up by the same <i>koinon</i> , and so this text should be considered alongside the more substantial evidence for the <i>koinon</i> of the priests of Apollo recorded in the new text. However, this connection is not strictly necessary and cannot be proven.
