i. Comments	The only argument for the tombstone belonging to an association is that the deceased is called ὁ ἰδ[ιος] [ἀ]δελφός, <i>ho id[ios] [a]delphos</i> (CIRB 967, ll. 1-2). For this formula, see also CIRB 104 from Pantikapaion, which is surely a thiasotic record, CAPInv. 1296 . But since the monument is fragmentary, it is not clear whether ἀδελφός, <i>adelphos</i> , ‘brother’, has a religious sense here.
