XII. NOTES

Comments	Saprykin 1990: 203-13 restores, not very convincingly, ll. 1-2 [- - ἐπὶ Φ]αρνακ[ίωνος Πόθου τοῦ συναγωγοῦ καὶ τοῦ ἐπὶ τῆς Γοργιππίας ἐν τῇ Δ]αειστοι μηνί ([- - epi Ph]arnak/ionos Pothou tou synagogou kai tou epi tes Gorgippias en tei D]aeisioi meni) and tries to identify this person in the Bosporan prosopography (see CIRB 1129 commented in CAPIv. 1310 , VII.ii. Leadership). Whatever the case may be, it remains probable that the record belongs to a cult association.
