## VII. ORGANIZATIONii. Leadership συναγωγός, synagogos (CIRB 1133, 1. 4; SEG 36: 794, 1. 5).

i.	Number	More than 11, as rests of at least 11 names (highly probably with patronymics) of members are preserved on the fragments of CIRB 1133. SEG 36: 794 preserves only the preamble.

i. Comments	V.P. Jajlenko (2010: 613) remarks the letter H at the place where the date of CIRB 1133 is expected: therefore, he restores $[\upsilon \pi] \eta$ , $[yp]e = 488$ year of the Bosporan era = AD 191. Both documents mention a $\sigma \upsilon \upsilon \alpha \gamma \omega \gamma \omega \gamma \delta \varsigma$ , $synagogos$ , at the head of the association (contrary to CAPInv. 1310, where we have a $i\epsilon \rho \epsilon \omega \varsigma$ , $hiereus$ , and a $\sigma \upsilon \upsilon \alpha \gamma \omega \gamma \omega \gamma \delta \varsigma$ , $synagogos$ ). Therefore, we consider them two different associations.
