L. 4 mentions a συνέδριον, <i>synedrion</i> (possibly the γέροντες, <i>gerontes</i> ; cf. Petzl ad loc.), ll. 6-7 could be restored τοῖς μετέχου[σι τοῦ γυμνασίου], <i>tois metechou[si tou gymnasiou]</i> (cf. Petzl ad loc.).
