Note

Though no specific mention of a *koinon* or *synodos*, it is not out of the ordinary for groups to simply refer to themselves as 'the dyers' or 'the weavers' in both papyri and inscriptions. It is not uncommon for an association to be identified simply as oi ταρσικάριοι *hoi tarsikarioi* without the use of *synodos*, *koinon*, *plethos* or other term. The honorific context also strongly suggests an action undertaken by an association of some sort.
