v. Relations	Sarapammon and Heras <i>may</i> have been sons of Syros although the fragmentary nature of the right side of the papyrus makes definitive identification very difficult.
vi. Proper names and physical features	Aurelius Neilos; Pammenes; Ammonios; Ammonios, son of Sarapas; Philosarapis; Sarapammon; Heras; Theodoros, son of Sakaon; Eros; Papontos, son of Demes; Ploutinus; Hippeus; Souchammon; Laskarios, son of Souchammon; Harendotes; Hierax, son of Epimachos; Papontos; [ . . . ], son of Kephalon (?); [ . . . ], son of Mono( ) (?); there are traces in l.38, 39 and traces in ll.42-45.
