i.b.	Document(s) typology & language/script	I.Kition 2002 is a dedication inscription in Greek. Themison, son of Pasiphilos, dedicated the mask of Dionysos, on behalf of the association of the elders, or in a shrine of the association (SEG 47: 1870).

ii.	Source(s) provenance	Found in Troulloi, ca. 12km north of Larnaka (ancient Kition), now in the Larnaka District Museum. For Troulloi, see Hermary 2004: 53-4.

	Note	The desiccant is a man.
iii.	Age	Elders
iv.	Status	The members of the association may have been those soldiers stationed around this area or veterans (SEG 54: 1531) who formed an association for athletic activities (I.Kition 2002). For Hellenistic <i>thiasoi</i> in the Mesaoria, see Hermary 2004: 54-5.

iii. Worship	I.Kition 2002 testifies to the dedication of the mask of Dionysos on behalf of the association. Nicolaou 1992: 260-1, no. 13 has proposed that the dedication was set up in a local rustic sanctuary (for a possible shrine of the association (see SEG 47: 1870). For the mask of Dionysos, see SEG 42: 1312.
