ii. References to buildings/objects	The association dedicates to the divinities a $\beta\omega\mu\delta\varsigma$ , bomos, and some $\pi\epsilon\rho\sigma\epsilon\alpha\iota$ , perseai, a type of tree.

ii.	Leadership	The man, called Sparis, mentioned in 1. 10, may be the leader of the association. However this is uncertain.
iii.	Members	The members are called οί θιασεῖται, hoi thiaseitai (l. 11), l. θιασῖται, thiasitai.
v.	Other staff	In II. 10-11, there is mention of οἱ κωμεγ έται, <i>hoi komegetai</i> : they probably were officials in charge of festive processions (κῶμοι, <i>komoi</i> ).

i.	Treasury/Funds	The associations probably had funds as they could pay for the altar and the setting up to the inscription.
ii.	Realty	The land upon which the trees dedicated by the association stood may have belonged to them: however this is not stated in the text and therefore remains uncertain.
