ii. Name elements	Cultic: <i>mystai</i> <i>sakephoroi</i> - the term relates to the humble dress worn by the members during ceremonies; cf. Jaccottet 2003: 242.	Theophoric: <i>Dionysos Koreseites</i>	Other: The loyalty to Rome is emphasized via the attribute <i>philosebastoi</i> (I.Eph(esos) 293, l. 7).

i.b. Document(s) typology & language/script	I.Eph(esos) 293 is an honorific decree for Commodus. I.Eph(esos) 1250 is a fragment from an unclear context.  In Greek.
i.c. Physical format(s)	I.Eph(esos) 1250: Upper part of a white marble base
ii. Source(s) provenance	I.Eph(esos) 293 is from an apsidal building near the baptismal font of John. I.Eph(esos) 1250 was built into a wall at the Northern Agora.

iv. Officials	ἱερατεύοντες, <i>hierateuontes</i> : I.Eph(esos) 293, l. 8. The plural shows that there must have been at least two priests, but the names have been erased and replaced with only one name, M. Aur. Menemachou, who was <i>archiereus</i> and <i>prytanis</i> of Ephesus.

iii. Worship	The god is linked to the Koressos quarter, on which see Engelmann 1997.
Deities worshipped	Dionysos <i>Koreseites</i>
iv. Honours/Other activities	Commodus is honored (I.Eph(esos) 293) as Neos Dionysos.
