Note	The name of the association has not survived. Cichorius ( <i>Altertümer von Hierapolis</i> , p. 52-53) wanted to insert [κη]π[ο]υρ(ῶν), [ke]p[o]ur(om), which is rejected as too short by Judeich. An ἐργασία τῶν κηπουργῶν, <i>ergasia ton kepourgon</i> is now known from <i>AAT</i> 101: 306, no. 25 (SEG 54: 1313). Cf. <a href="#">CAPInv. 188</a> .
