Note	This identification as a possible association rests in part on internal parallels within this text (II. 8 and 25) where titles of officers are ascribed to people serving the same function Ninnos appears to serve here: receiving payment and presumably coordinating the work. Unlike in those situations, we have neither the mention of a title or of a familiar term describing the group as such ( <i>koinon, synodos</i> ). Instead, they are just referred to as the $\hat{\eta}\lambda$ 0κ $\hat{\delta}\pi$ 01 <i>helokopoi</i> - which does not necessarily rule out their operation as an association either.
