Note	The text remains unpublished. But, according to Collart who briefly commented on it, it "semble être un fragment de règlement religieux". Because of the presence of the term <i>thiasus</i> , moreover, he associated it with the cult of Liber Pater, well-attested at Philippi. Two <i>thiasi</i> evolving around this cult are currently attested at this colony, namely <i>thiasus Liberi Patris Tasibasteni</i> (see CAPInv. 1754) and <i>thiasus Maenad(um) regianarum</i> (see CAPInv. 708).
