It is not clear whether this <i>curator</i> should be linked to the association.
viii.	Obligations	The <i>thiasus</i> was involved in the celebration of <i>Rosalia</i> at the tombs of those having left bequests for this purpose.

iv. Endowments	The <i>thiasus</i> is named as the recipient of a bequest left for the celebration of the Rosalia; the amount is not preserved.
