iii. Members	Five members are named: Gisnes, son of Erdes, Orontes, son of Kindous, Kindos, son of Kindous, Kindos, son of Marbolos, Kebaigaeis, son of Trokondimotos
vi. Laws and rules	The rules include the prohibition against a member selling his own share and details of the allocation within the grave: sons born of the members' wives are to be interred in the upper section of the grave. Only fragments of the following lines are extant; these might possibly concern the children born of other unions, that is, illegitimate children or maybe adopted children, who are not to be buried in the upper section.

VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

i. Treasury/Funds	The members of the association were involved in the grave or the association with a sum of money. Here, the five association members have not only constructed the grave for a shared cost (Il. 7-10, οὗτοι πέντοι τὸ μνήμα δαπάνη κοινῇ κατήρτισαν, <i>houtoi pentoi to mnema dapanēi koinei katertisan</i>), but have also made a monetary deposit of an unidentified sum (παραθήκασαν, <i>parathekasan</i> , Il. 10-11).
