Note	The name συγγενεῖς ἀπὸ ἸΟνασικλεῦς τοῦ Χαρικλείτου (syggeneis apo Onasikleus tou Charikleitou II. 1-2) suggests that membership was open to the descendants of the male line of Oansikles.
v. Relations	The honorand, Kynnida, is the wife of the founder of the group.

iv.	Honours/Other activities	The group honoured the wife of the founder (most likely with a statue as suggested by the shape of the stone).

Note	The term <i>syggeneis</i> stands for members of a familial group, whose male line of descent is made apparent in the name of the group: <i>apo Onasikleus tou Charikleitou</i> . Although the private character of the group is unquestioned, its durability eludes us.
