Despite the fragmentary nature of the evidence, the *koinon* honoured someone with a crown (στε[φάνωσιν], *stephanosin* II. 4-5) and proclamation of the honours (ά δὲ ἀναγόρευσις, *ha de anagoreusis* I. 5).

XIII. EVALUATION i. Private association Probable Note A koinon whose name is not preserved bestows honours to someone. Despite the fragmentary nature of the evidence, the term koinon points to a private association (in a Koan context the term koinon seems to be reserved for private associations).
