XII. NOTES

i. Comments	The text reads: <i>vacat</i> στεφανοθέντες ὑπὸ τῶν θιασωτῶν ἀνέθεσαν <i>vacat</i> , <i>stephanothentes hypo ton thiasoton anethesan</i> . One would expect it to be preceded by personal names of officials of the group (e.g. X and Y and Z. <i>tamiai</i> , etc), designating the identity of those who set up the dedication.
