i. Comments	The text reads: $vacat$ στεφανωθέντες ὑπὸ τῶν θιασωτῶν ἀνέθεσαν $vacat$, $stephanothentes hypo ton thiasoton anethesan$. One would expect it to be preceded by personal names of officials of the group (e.g. X and Y and Z $tamiai$, etc.), designating the identity of those who set up the dedication.

i. Private association Note Probable Given the nature and typology of the text, the *thiasotai* mentioned are most probably a private association (to what extent identical with any of the groups attested in the area remains unknown).
