Note	The grammar and the vocative ἑτέρε. <i>l</i> . ἑταῖρε, <i>hetaire</i> (l. 9) 'companion' suggest that the members were men.

i. Private association	Probable
Note	The term <i>synodos</i> suggests the nature of a private association. The reference to the theatrical stage and the geographical reference to Paphus in the epithet of Aphrodite may point to the branch of the Dionysian artists based at Paphus on Cyprus.
