The compound name likely suggests a founder or a benefactor of the association, (cf. Thomsen (forthcoming), Gabrielsen 1997 p. 126-7, Maiuri 1916 p. 141, Poland 1909 p. 73-6).	
	Topographical:	Βοαρσαί, <i>Boarsai</i> , l. 24 - The meaning of the word is unknown, but it may stem from a village, district or a neighbourhood. (Cf. CAPInv. 2015).
