Theophoric: Άθαναιισταί, Athanaistai - From the doric spelling of Athena (Morrelli, Iculti in Rodi [Pisa, 1959] 2-13, 80-89). The character of the association is greatly reminiscent of other associations described as κοινὸν, koinon, Note although the descriptive term has been omitted in this case.
