IG II² 1256: Found in Piraeus, acquired in 1894 by the Ny Carlsberg Glyptothek, now in Copenhagen, no. 1043a. IG II² 1324: Found in Zanneion, Peiraeus, later in the house of Al. Meletopoulos. IG II² 1361: Found in Piraeus, now in the Epigraphical Museum, EM 7755.</p>

ii. References to buildings/objects	A precinct (<i>ἱερόν, hieron</i> , IG II ² 1255, l. 16; IG II ² 1256, ll. 11-2; IG II ² 1324, ll. 2, 27; IG II ² 1361, ll. 9-10) of the goddess, with a house (<i>οἰκία, oikia</i> , IG II ² 1361, ll. 9-10), is mentioned as well as a dedication (<i>ἀνάθημα, anathema</i> , IG II ² 1324, ll. 26, 30) and <i>stelai</i> in IG II ² 1361, ll. 22-3.

VII. ORGANIZATION

iii. Members	The members of the group are called ὄργεωνες, <i>orgeones</i> (IG II ² 1324, l. 20; IG II ² 1361, 3, 18, 21). Ferguson 1944: 99 argued that membership to the group was hereditary before the introduction of the apparently new rules in IG II ² 1361, cf. Arnaoutoglou 2003: 96.
iv. Officials	<p>Sacred officials: Ἱεροποιοί, <i>hieropoioi</i> (IG II² 1255, ll. 2-3; IG II² 1361, 16-18); priest (ἱερεύς, <i>hiereus</i>, IG II² 1361, l. 7) and priestess (ἱέρεια, <i>hiereia</i>, IG II² 1361, ll. 4, 7).</p> <p>Administrative officials: Stewards (ἐπιμεληταί, <i>epimeletai</i>, IG II² 1256, l. 3; IG II² 1324, l. 1; IG II² 1361, ll. 15-16); secretary (γραμματεύς, <i>grammateus</i>, IG II² 1255, l. 17; IG II² 1324, ll. 29-30); treasurer (ταμίας, <i>tamias</i>, IG II² 1324, l. 32).</p> <p>Ferguson 1944: 102 maintained that <i>hieropoioi</i> were <i>polis</i>-appointees; cf. Arnaoutoglou 2003: 107.</p>

vi. Laws and rules	IG II ² 1361 contains a set of regulations called law (<i>vόμος, nomos</i> , l.) of the association. They concern the procedure of joining the group (ll. 20-23), selling the water of the sanctuary (ll. 8-12), performing sacrifices (ll. 3-8), convening assemblies (ll. 16-17), fines against officials violating the rules (ll. 13-14).
vii. Judicial system	In IG II ² 1361, ll. 7-8, 13-14, 20 there are monetary fines against those who violate the rules prescribed. In l. 14 there is a provision for expulsion, καὶ μὴ μετέστω αὐτῶι τῶν κοινῶν, <i>kai me metesto autoi ton koinon</i> .
viii. Obligations	In IG II ² 1361, 21-22 there is a provision about the payment of an entrance fee to prospective members.
ix. Privileges	In IG II ² 1361, 3 exemption from payment of a fee (<i>ἀτέλεια, ateleia</i>) is provided to members for sacrificing.

VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

ii. Realty	There are several references to a precinct (<i>ἱερόν, hieron</i> , IG II ² 1255, 16; IG II ² 1256, 11-12; IG II ² 1324, ll. 2-3, 27; IG II ² 1361, 9-10) of the goddess, with a house (<i>οἰκία, oikia</i> , IG II ² 1361, 9-10).
iii. Income	The income to support the association's activities comes from the entrance fee (IG II ² 1361, 21-22), the fines (IG II ² 1361, ll. 13-14) and the sale of water (IG II ² 1361, l. 9).

ii. Gender	Men

iii. Age	Adults
iv. Status	From the individuals named in the inscriptions two (or perhaps three) are certainly citizens. The remaining are unidentified, as they are designated with a personal name only. Wilhelm 1905: 134 could not pronounce on the status of individuals of IG II ² 1256.

X. ACTIVITIES

i. Assemblies	In IG II ² 1361, l. 16 it is clearly ordained that monthly assemblies (<i>ἀγορὰν καὶ ξύλλογον ποιεῖν, agoran kai syllagon poiein</i>) should be held on the second day of each month in the sanctuary about the common affairs on the initiative of <i>hieropoioi</i> and stewards.
ii. Meetings and events	In IG II ² 1255, ll. 5-6 a procession (<i>πομπή, pompe</i>) and distribution of the meat (<i>κρεανομία, kreanomia</i>) are mentioned. A procession is also mentioned in IG II ² 1324, l. 5.
iii. Worship	In IG II ² 1255, ll. 5-6 a procession (<i>πομπή, pompe</i>) and distribution of the meat (<i>κρεανομία, kreanomia</i>) are mentioned. A procession is also mentioned in IG II ² 1324, l. 5. Sacrifices (<i>θυσίαι, thyssai</i>) are mentioned in IG II ² 1361, ll. 2-6.

Deities worshipped	The main deity honoured is Bendis (IG II ² 1255, ll. 16-7; IG II ² 1324, l. 15) sometimes referred to as simply the goddess (ἡ θεός, <i>he theos</i> , IG II ² 1256, ll. 6, 12; IG II ² 1324, l. 5) while Deloptes is mentioned only in IG II ² 1324, l. 15.
iv. Honours/Other activities	The association awards a golden crown (<i>χρυσοῦς στέφανος</i> , <i>chrysous stephanos</i>) to each official honoured in IG II ² 1255, ll. 8-9 and IG II ² 1256, l. 9. In contrast in IG II ² 1324, l. 19 an olive leaves crown (<i>θαλλοῦ στέφανος</i> , <i>thallou stephanos</i>) and the place to erect a dedication (<i>ἀνάθημα</i> , <i>anathema</i>) is awarded.

XII. NOTES

i. Comments	IG II ² 1255: The decree passed when archon was Phrynicos. IG II ² 1256: The decree passed when archon was Kephisophon. Wilhelm 1902, followed by Ferguson 1944: 98, has argued that this group of documents was issued by the citizen <i>orgeones</i> of Bendis; cf. Arnaoutoglou 2003: 59-60.
